OPENING HYMN (CWS 717) When You Woke that Thursday Morning (Sung to the tune of CW 107: Jesus, Refuge of the Weary)

INSTRUCTION FOR THE END OF LENT

M: In the Lenten season we hear again how our Lord walked the path of suffering which led Him to the cross for our salvation. We also hear our Lord's call to intensify our struggle against sin, death, and the devil – all that keeps us from loving God and one another. This is the struggle to which we were committed at Baptism; God's forgiveness and the power of His Spirit to amend our lives continue with us because of His love for us in Jesus our Savior.

Within the family of the Church, God never wearies of giving peace and new life. In the absolution, we receive forgiveness as from God Himself. We should not doubt this absolution, but firmly believe that our sins are thus forgiven before God in heaven, for it comes to us in the name and by the command of our Lord.

We who receive God's love in Jesus Christ are called to love one another, to be servants to each other, as Jesus became our servant.

In Holy Communion the members of Christ's body participate most intimately in his love. Remembering our Lord's Last Supper with his disciples, we eat the bread and drink the cup of this meal. Together we receive the Lord's gift of his body and blood for forgiveness and participate in the new covenant that makes us one with him and one another. The Lord's Supper is the promise of the great banquet we will share with all the faithful when our Lord returns, the joyous culmination of our reconciliation with God and each other.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

M: Therefore, let us confess our sins to God and ask for His forgiveness.

C: Almighty God, merciful Father,

I confess to you that I have not loved you with all my heart.

In what I have done and left undone,

I have pursued my ways instead of your ways.

I have not loved my brothers and sisters as myself.

For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity.

I am truly sorry for my sins.

I repent of them.

I beg for your mercy, O Lord.

Silence for meditation

M: Forgive us for the sake of Jesus Christ who suffered and died for us.

C: Cleanse me from my sins.

Release me from my guilt.

Grant me your Holy Spirit to amend my sinful life.

M: The almighty God has been merciful to us and has sent His Son to die for all. For His sake, God forgives our sins and calls us from darkness to His marvelous light.

Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son $\frac{1}{4}$ and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

EXHORTATION

M: Our Lord Jesus Christ has forgiven us and reconciled us to God and has promised us the power to forgive and love each other. Relying on his promise, therefore, be reconciled with one another.

M and C: Brothers and sisters, may the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, in our words, and in our actions.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray.

Lord Jesus Christ, in the sacrament of Holy Communion, you give us your true body and blood as a remembrance of your suffering and death on the cross. Grant us so firmly to believe your words and promise that we may always partake of this sacrament to our eternal good; for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

THE WORD OF GOD FOR MAUNDY THURSDAY

FIRST LESSON Exodus 12:21-30

²¹ Then Moses summoned all the elders of Israel and said to them, "Go and take lambs for yourselves according to your family size, and slaughter the Passover lamb. ²² You shall take a bundle of hyssop, dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and paint the lintel and the two doorposts with the blood that is in the basin. None of you are to go out of the door of your house until morning. ²³ When the LORD passes through to strike Egypt and sees the blood on the lintel and the two doorposts, the LORD will pass over that door and will not allow the destroyer to enter your houses to strike you.

²⁴ "You shall observe these instructions as a perpetual regulation for you and your descendants. ²⁵ When you enter the land that the LORD will give you just as he said he would, you shall observe this ceremony. ²⁶ So when your children ask you, 'What does this ceremony mean to you?' ²⁷ you will say, 'It is the sacrifice of the Passover to the LORD, who passed over the houses of the Israelites in Egypt. When he struck the Egyptians, he spared our houses.'"

The people bowed down and worshipped. ²⁸ The Israelites went and did all this. They did just as the LORD had commanded Moses and Aaron.

²⁹ At midnight the LORD struck down all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh, who sat on his throne, to the firstborn of the prisoner who was in the dungeon, even all the firstborn of the livestock. ³⁰ During the night Pharaoh got up—he, all his servants, and all the Egyptians—and there was a loud outcry in Egypt, for there was not a house where there was not someone dead.

VERSE OF THE DAY

M: As often as you eat of this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

STAND

GOSPEL LESSON

Mark 14:12-26

¹² On the first day of the Festival of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb is sacrificed, his disciples asked him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" ¹³ He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city, and there a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him. ¹⁴ Wherever he enters, tell the owner of the house that the Teacher says, 'Where is my guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' ¹⁵ He will show you a large upper room, furnished and ready. Make preparations for us there."

¹⁶ His disciples left and went into the city and found things just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover.

¹⁷ When it was evening, he arrived with the Twelve.

¹⁸ While they were reclining and eating, Jesus said, "Amen I tell you: One of you will betray me, one who is eating with me."

¹⁹ They began to be sorrowful and said to him one by one, "Surely not I?"


²⁰ He said to them, "It is one of the Twelve, one who is dipping bread with me in the dish. ²¹ Indeed, the Son of Man is going to go just as it has been written about him, but woe to that man by whom the Son of Man is betrayed! It would have been better for that man if he had not been born."

²² While they were eating, Jesus took bread. When he had blessed it, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, "Take it. This is my body."

²³ Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them. They all drank from it. ²⁴ He said to them, "This is my blood of the new testament, which is poured out for many. ²⁵ Amen I tell you: I will certainly not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God." ²⁶ After they sang a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives.

- **M:** Lord God, heavenly Father, author of the everlasting covenant and giver of the cup of salvation,
- C: We gather in your courts to offer you our sacrifice of thanksgiving.
- **M:** For fulfilling your promise to establish a new covenant through the blood of your Son, Jesus Christ,
- C: We give you humble and hearty thanks.
- **M:** As our Lord Jesus Christ gave thanks to you when he broke the bread, as he gave thanks to you when he took the cup,
- C: We also give you thanks.
- M: Precious Savior, both Priest and offering, awe and wonder fill our hearts as we partake of your body, broken for us, and your blood, shed for us.
- C: We praise you, bless you, and adore you, Lord Jesus Christ.
- **M:** In our poverty of righteousness, we have nothing to offer. Without your tremendous sacrifice, we would still be in our sins,
- C: But through your sacrament of the New Testament, we are assured that our iniquities are forgiven and our sins are no longer remembered.
- M: O Holy Spirit, dwell within us as we remember our Lord's death in this sacrament. Enter our hearts to strengthen our faith and fill us with gratitude for your great mercy.

C: Move us to encourage one another to love and to do good works.

Special prayers and intercessions may follow.

M: Hear us, Lord, as we bring you our private petitions.

Silent prayer.

M: As our Lord served his disciples by washing their feet, so may we also humbly serve one another.

C: Help us live our lives as sacrifices of thanksgiving to him who first loved us. Amen.

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THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. M: The Lord be with you.C: And also with you.


M: Lift up your hearts.


WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."

M: The peace of the Lord be with you always.

C: Amen. (spoken)




DISTRIBUTION

STAND




M: O God the Father, source of all goodness, in your loving kindness you sent your Son to share our humanity. We thank you that through him you have given us pardon and peace in this sacrament. We also pray that you will not forsake us but will rule our hearts and minds by your Holy Spirit so that we willingly serve you day after day, through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen. (spoken)

Following the distribution prayer, the service continues with the Stripping of the Altar.

THE STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR

The stripping of the altar symbolizes the abandonment of Jesus by His disciples and prepares the sanctuary for the austerity of Good Friday. During the Stripping of the Altar, the congregation sings Lamb of God, Pure and Holy (CW 268). After the stripping of the altar, there is the reading of Psalm 88 – a psalm of Jesus' abandonment.

PSALM 88

¹O LORD, the God who saves me, by day I cry out. At night I cry before you. ² May my prayer come before you. Turn your ear to my cry. ³ Indeed, my soul has had its fill of troubles, and my life has arrived at the grave. ⁴I am treated like those who go down to the pit. I am like someone without strength. ⁵ I am turned loose with the dead. I am like the slain who lie in the grave, like the ones you do not remember anymore, like those who are cut off from your hand. ⁶ You have put me in the lowest pit, in dark places, in the depths. ⁷ Your wrath presses against me. You have battered me with all your breakers. ⁸ You have distanced my acquaintances from me. You have made me repulsive to them. I am shut in and I cannot get out. ⁹ My eyesight grows dim from affliction. I call to you, O LORD, every day. I spread out my hands to you.

10 Is it for the dead that you do a miracle?

Do the spirits of the dead rise up and praise you?

11 Is your mercy declared in the tomb,
your faithfulness in decay?

12 Is your wonderful work known in the darkness?

Is your righteousness known in the land of forgetfulness?

13 But I cry to you, O LORD,
and in the morning my prayer comes before you.

18 You have distanced my loved one and friend from me.

My only friend is darkness.

No benediction is spoken to end the service.

The minister exits the chancel.

Each worshipper may remain for prayer and meditation before dispersing quietly.

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Personal Prayers for Worship

Before Communion:

Lord, I am not worthy to be a guest at your holy table. But you are the friend of sinners, and you will not cast me out. This bread is your body, which bore my sins upon the tree. This wine is your blood, which purifies me from all guilt. At your invitation, I come rejoicing. Receive me, my Savior.
