PSALM PRAYER



ADVENT DEVOTION

Jeremiah 33:14 (NKJV)

"Behold, the days are coming," says the LORD, "that I will perform that good thing which I have promised to the house of Israel and to the house of Judah."

Behold! Promise Kept!

ADVENT LITANY

M: A voice cries out in the wilderness; the prophet demanding change:

C: Prepare the way of the LORD; fill in the valleys, level the ridges, straighten the crooked, move the mountains.

M: God's glory shall be revealed and every eye shall see it!

C: Smooth the rough places, move the mountains, let your glory be displayed!

M: In the wilderness of our cities, where so many people jostle without love, or get lost in suburbia, where people live anonymous lives in luxurious homes and rented rooms, and broken men line up at shelters for a bed and respite from dereliction — in these places, Prepare the way of the Lord!

C: Smooth the rough places, move the mountains, let your glory be displayed!

M: In the wilderness of half-hearted religion, where theological fashions come and go, buildings and crowds persist as symbols of status, and pomp and show are high on the ratings; where evangelism can be considered poor taste, prayer and sacrifice as optional extras, and even Jesus is feared as "extremist" in these places, Prepare the way of the Lord!.

C: Smooth the rough places, move the mountains, let your glory be displayed!

M: Voice in the wilderness, what shall we do? Prophet of the Lord, what is the word?

C: "Turn, turn, turn to the Lord."

M: You who have two suits, give one to the naked; if you eat well, share with the hungry; in business and authority, deal with compassion – and be ready for the One who comes with fire." In this way, Prepare the way of the Lord!

C: Smooth the rough places, move the mountains, let your glory be displayed!
