CONFESSION OF SINS



FIRST LESSON Acts 4:8-12

⁸ Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders of Israel, ⁹ if we are being questioned today for a kind act that was done for the lame man, as to how this man has been healed, ¹⁰ let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead! By him this man stands before you healed. ¹¹ This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you builders, which has become the cornerstone. ¹² There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to people by which we must be saved."

SECOND LESSON 1 Peter 2:4-10

⁴ As you come to him, the Living Stone, rejected by men but chosen by God and precious, ⁵ you also, like living stones, are being built as a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, in order to bring spiritual sacrifices that are acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For it says in Scripture:

See, I lay a stone in Zion,

a chosen and precious cornerstone,

and the one who believes in him will certainly not be put to shame.

⁷ Therefore, for you who believe, this is an honor. But for those who do not believe:

"The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone," ⁸ and, "a stone over which they stumble

and a rock over which they fall."

Because they continue to disobey the word, they stumble over it. And that is the consequence appointed for them. ⁹ But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, the people who are God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰ At one time you were not a people, but now you are the people of God. At one time you were not shown mercy, but now you have been shown mercy.

GOSPEL LESSON John 14:1-11

"Do not let your heart be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. ² In my Father's house are many mansions. If it were not so, I would have told you. I am going to prepare a place for you. ³ And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and take you to be with me, so that you may also be where I am. ⁴ You know where I am going, and you know the way."

⁵ "Lord, we don't know where you are going," Thomas replied, "so how can we know the way?"

⁶ Jesus said to him, "I am the Way and the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father, except through me. ⁷ If you know me, you would also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

⁸ "Lord," said Philip, "show us the Father, and that is enough for us."

⁹ "Have I been with you so long," Jesus answered, "and you still do not know me, Philip? The one who has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰ Don't you believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I am telling you I am not speaking on my own, but the Father who remains in me is doing his works. ¹¹ Believe me that I am in the Father, and the Father is in me. Or else believe because of the works themselves.

M: Lift up your hearts.




M: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


WORDS OF INSTITUTION



Proposed Summer Worship Schedule

At the April 23rd Open Forum, a suggestion was brought forward by the Worship Committee and discussed with members in attendance to transition from two to one service on Sundays during the summer months. This approach to our summer worship would help create additional fellowship opportunities for Lord of Love members to worship together while allowing the continuation of Bible studies. Summer attendance was also reviewed for the last four years indicating lighter attendance to further support one service. Overall feedback from members in attendance at the Open Forum was positive and in favor of the change.

As follow-up to this support from members in attendance at the open forum, the Church Council in consultation with Pastor Jenswold and Elders Committee are recommending moving forward with holding one service at 9:00 AM during the months of June, July, and August (June 4 – Aug. 27, 2023). A Bible study will be held each Sunday at 8:00 AM. We will return to the two-service schedule starting in September.
